

#### By air

#### Aberdeen International Airport operates flights from around the world and many key



#### By train or bus

To plan your journey, call 0871 200 22 33 or visit travelinescotland.com for the most up-to-date information on public transport in Scotland. The main train companies are Scotrail (scotrail.co.uk) and Virgin East Coast (virgintrainseastcoast.com), and the main bus companies are Stagecoach (stagecoachbus. com) and Megabus (megabus.com).

Hop on First Aberdeen and Stagecoach services with the multi-operator scheme Grasshopper, with full details at grasshopperpass.co.uk.

Details of train Park and Ride routes and timetables are available from scotrail.co.uk. Cycle parking is also available at the railway station and park and rides.



#### By road

Drivers are advised to use car parks on the side of city they arrive in eg, East North Street, Bon Accord Shopping Centre if you're coming on the Ago Peterhead/Fraserburgh road or the Ag6 Inverness-Aberdeen road, or College Street Car Park, Union Square Shopping Centre if you're coming in from the south Ago Dundee road. Spaces in NCP car parks can be pre-booked. More details are available from www.aberdeencity.gov.uk



#### By Park and Ride

There are Park and Choose sites at Ellon (north of the city), Bridge of Don (in the north of the city), Woodhill House (on Westburn Road in the west of the city. Weekends only), and Kingswells (west of the city). All Park and Ride bus services travel to the city centre. Services will run through December.

#### Ellon

Stagecoach (stagecoachbus.com) operate regular services Monday - Sunday, with the journey taking 40 to 50 minutes.

#### **Bridge of Don and Kingswells**

First Aberdeen (firstgroup.com/Aberdeen) operate services from Bridge of Don and Kingswells Monday - Saturday, which run every 15 minutes at peak times and 30 minutes offpeak (Mon to Fri) and every 20 mins (Sat).

Stagecoach operate services from Kingswells which run up to every 12 minutes Monday -Saturday and every 20 minutes on Sunday. Stagecoach will also operate a Sunday service from Bridge of Don on 27 November, 4, 11 and 18 December.

#### Woodhill House

First Aberdeen services 23 and X40 and Stagecoach service X18 pass Woodhill House, and parking is available Saturday and Sunday only for the four weekends before Christmas. The bus stops on Westburn Road.

## TRAVELLING AROUND ABERDEEN



# By foot

Aberdeen city centre is easy to find your way around on foot, with shopping and most Winter Festival activities centred near Union Street.



#### By bike

There are 20 cycle parking locations across the city, with a map available from aberdeencity. gov.uk, the Tourist Information Centre on Union Street, Central Library and bike shops.



#### By taxi

There are taxi ranks during the day on Belmont Street, Chapel Street, Back Wynd, and the railway station. Night-time ranks are available on Union Street.



#### **Road Closures**

#### By bus

First Aberdeen operates buses to the city centre, and around Aberdeen. Exact change must be used. First also operates a Night Bus service at weekends. Stagecoach operates

buses from Aberdeenshire and various city locations.

Due to the Christmas Village, bus services utilising the bus stops on Union Terrace will be diverted. Affected services can be accessed at the following nearby locations: Skene Square (the north side just before the roundabout), Rosemount Viaduct (the south side at Skene Street) and Guild Street/Union Square Bus Station. Two further additional stops will also be provided at Wapping Street (the south side past the junction with Bridge Street) and on Denburn Road at Patagonian Court. For further information, please check with your bus operator before travelling.



#### **Car Parking**

Please park on the side of city you arrive in to try and reduce the amount of traffic crossing through the city centre. Don't forget to use Frederick Street and the part-time Marischal Street car parks.

The four disabled car park spaces on Union Terrace are to be moved and an extra two created: two on Diamond Street, two on Skene Terrace, and two on Rosemount Viaduct outside nos 41 to 45. In addition, five disabled car parking spaces created on the inset road at Schoolhill outside Robert Gordon's College are to continue for the festive season. The existing disabled bays on Back Wynd and Little Belmont Street will also be operational.
