ABERDEEN MARITIME MUSEUM

Where: Shiprow, Aberdeen AB11 5BY

The award-winning Aberdeen Maritime Museum is located on the historic Shiprow, a 5-minute walk from The Green, and incorporates Provost Ross' House which was built in 1593.

This museum is home to a very interesting collection that covers shipbuilding, sailing ships, and the port's history which you get a fantastic view of whilst in the building.
