The award-winning <u>Aberdeen Maritime Museum</u> is located on the historic Shiprow and incorporates Provost Ross's House, which was built in 1593.

This museum is home to a very interesting collection that covers shipbuilding, sailing ships, and the port's history which you get a fantastic view of whilst in the building.



Have your mind blown at Aberdeen Science Centre

<u>Aberdeen Science Centre</u> has recently had a transformational renovation, meaning this attraction just got even better!

Over 60 new interactive exhibits await visitors, including The OPITO Theatre of Energy - the UK's first immersive experience of its kind - and RoboThespian, a chatty humanoid robot. Don't be mistaken - ASC isn't just for kids and can be enjoyed by all ages!

Day 2 - Explore open spaces

Go back in time to Old Aberdeen

Address: Old Aberdeen, Aberdeen

Old Aberdeen is a favourite landmark of many who visit the Granite City. This quaint old town is a photographer's paradise, as cobbled streets run through this area which is filled with buildings as old as the 14th century.

Old Aberdeen is home to the University of Aberdeen campus, which although features beautiful, historical buildings, also features newer architecturally unique buildings such as the Sir Duncan Rice library.





Lose yourself in Johnston Gardens

This city garden may just be the most Instagrammable spot in Aberdeen! <u>Johnston Gardens</u> is home to streams, waterfalls, ponds, rockeries, and a vibrant blue bridge which all make this an idyllic paradise within the city.

Lunch and ice cream at Mackie's 19.2

Mackie's 19.2 is their first ice cream parlour, located exactly 19.2 miles from the family farm where they first started making their famous ice cream!

Day 2 - Explore open spaces

Visit Seaton Park

Address: Don St, Old Aberdeen, Aberdeen AB24 1XS

What makes Aberdeen so special is that of course there wonderful indoor attractions to visit, but there is also beautiful open spaces plotted throughout the city such as Seaton Park.

This park is known for its vibrant flowerbeds that pop with colour, the rose beds and the walled garden that people visit all year round. This is just one of the many popular parks within the city that is beloved by locals!





Blow off the cobwebs at Aberdeen Beach
